Three year LL.B. (Semester Course) Examination (To be effective from academic session 2009-10)

The three year LL.B. Semester course is a regular course under Sambalpur University for its constituent as well as all affiliated law Colleges.

1. Eligibility for Admission:

A candidate for admission to the three year degree course must have obtained a bachelor's degree in any discipline of studies from a University or any other qualification considered equivalent by academic council of Sambalpur University.

2. Qualifying marks for admission:

a. 45% of marks in aggregate in graduation in case of general candidate.

b. 40% of marks in aggregate in graduation in case of SC/ST candidate. Provided that such a minimum qualifying marks shall not automatically entitle a candidate to get admission into an institution but only shall entitle the candidate concerned to fulfill other institutional criteria notified by the institution concerned or by the government concerned from time to apply for admission.

3. Admission procedure:

Admission to the three year LL.B. Degree semester course is made purely on merit basis according to the marks obtained in the qualifying graduation degree.

4. Intake and reservation:

The intake capacity of the constituent and affiliated colleges under Sambalpur University shall be decided by the Sambalpur University from time to time

Reservation: As per instruction given by the Government from time to time.

5. Course duration:

The duration of the course shall be three academic years consisting of six semesters of six months duration.

- a. The first, third and fifth semester will commence from 1st June and continue upto 30th November. Similarly the second, forth and sixth semester will commence from 1st December and continue upto 31st May every calendar year.
- b. At the end of every semester there shall be a University examination of 100 marks in each subject of study.

7. Pass Mark:

a. 40 marks in each paper and 50% of total marks in aggregate by all papers of that examination.

b. A candidate securing in all the six semester examination taken together

- i. 50% or more marks but less than 60% marks shall be awarded second class and
- a candidate securing 60% or above shall be awarded first class.

8. Back Paper:

Candidates securing 50% or more marks in aggregate of any semester examination but securing less than 40% marks in any paper of that examination shall have the option of appearing in that paper of that examination, when that semester examination will be held next within a period of two successive chances. of Motification No-5974 (9)/ACD-1 (BOS) Dt. 08/08/16

9. Number of chances for clearing a particular semester:

An unsuccessful candidate will be given two subsequent chances to clear a particular semester examination.

10. Eligibility to obtain LL.B. degree:

A candidate shall be entitled to obtain LL.B. degree after passing all the semester examinations of the course. However a candidate shall not be allowed to sit in 6th semester examination unless he/she clears 1st,2nd,3rd,4th and 5th semester.

11. General instructions:

- a. A candidate shall be eligible to fill up final application form to appear at any semester examination, if he/she attended at least 70% of the classes in theory and practical papers. However he/she may be admitted to that examination on production of a medical certificate if he/she has attended at least 65% of classes in theory and practical
- b. The examination for 1st, 3rd and 5th semester shall be held in the month of November each year and 2nd, 4th and 6th semester shall be held in May each year.
- c. All theory examination shall be conducted by means of written papers of three hour duration and shall carry 100 marks.
- d. The practical papers will be partly written and partly oral. The mark apportionment is specified in the courses of studies.
- e. The candidates are required to maintain practical record in each practical (clinical) papers according to the instruction given by the College.
